I like going out for dog walks with my friends. Recently I have been studying for my mock exams as I want to be a PE teacher.


Favourite food: Pesto pasta (Stephs cooking is better than Dads) See you on the rally field.

Caught Early its very treatable so Don't delay, do it, the risks for us Guys is huge.



I REMEMBER WHEN.....BY CLEM FELLOWS

In 1988 and 1991 Bridget and I along with John & Sheila Hunt and Tom & Eunice Porter ran two 14 day holiday rallies at Crackington Haven in North Cornwall, which was a lovely site between Boscastle and Bude. It was a 7 acre field with a slope towards the bottom of the field, the top was fairly level for about 100 feet then the slope began.

On both rallies among the things we organised were cream teas and barbeques on the field, off field events included an evening mystery tour which was organised with the local coach firm, there were enough people to hire two coaches.

The coaches arrived around 6pm and the ralliers boarded the coaches and settled down in their seats, it was then, OH DEAR, CALAMITY, we found THERE WERE NO SEATS FOR THE RALLY OFFICERS, so after speaking with the drivers who would not tell us where they were going, it was decided to follow the coaches in our cars. This got quite interesting at times with other traffic. At the first stop a lovely country pub, ralliers asked us where we were going next, they didn't believe us when we said "We haven't got a clue, we have to follow the coaches". Once again, our little convoy of two coaches and cars got underway. We dutifully followed the coaches until the last stop which was at a Fish & Chip Shop, they sold the best fish and chips in Cornwall. (found out later it was at Lanivet) Everyone enjoyed the evening.

Especially as it was a mystery trip, whereby apart from the coach drivers none of us knew where we were going or where we had been!

Another trip we organised on both rallies was a day trip to the Scilly Isles from Penzance by sea. Whilst organising the content of the rally programme for the fortnight, John Hunt contacted The Isles of Scilly Steamship Company and was quoted a price of £19 return, he then contacted the coach firm and asked the price of a return coach to take us to Penzance in time for the ships departure, to our amazement they quoted us a price of £19 for the coach and ship, but it would entail an early departure from the rally field and a late return, we asked if they could stop at the Fish & Chip Shop on the return from Penzance to which they agreed.

On the allotted day the ralliers who had booked the trip congregated at 5-30am to board the coach which left at 6am to arrive in Penzance for a 9-30am sailing. In those days the main A39 road was single carriageway all the way to Penzance passing through all the towns and villages, no bypasses in those days.

We all boarded RMS Scillonian 3 (RMS means Royal Mail Steamer) and after approx. 2 hours arrived at St Marys where we disembarked to explore the Islands, some went to Tresco and other islands, some took the island bus tour with the hilarious drivers commentary. He was really happy at one stage as he actually got into third gear!

Later we embarked again for the return voyage to Penzance and the coach home to the rally field, after fish and chips, arriving just before midnight, what an experience.

I REMEMBER WHEN.....CONTINUED...

In 1991 it had rained for about three weeks before the rally and the field was soft, but the rain had stopped three days earlier and the sun was shining, it never rained for the rest of the rally.

We all arrived and decided where we were going to site our vans which we did, but after unhitching my car sunk to the depth of the tyres, and Roger the farmer said he would bring a tractor for us to use, as we had decided that everyone would leave their cars at the top level part of the field and we would tow the vans down with the tractor, so into the field came a big John Deere tractor,

Roger explained the controls to us and it was decided that I would drive it with Tom hitching and unhitching vans and John organising the car park. Funnily enough no one objected to leaving their cars when it was explained why, and later on ralliers told us they thought it was wonderful not having cars passing their vans whilst they were relaxing, also it was peaceful and that children could play without having to dodge moving traffic.

The tractor he loaned us, was the latest model with a quadraphonic sound system, hydraulic hitch, etc with only 7 (SEVEN) miles on the clock over the fortnight we towed all the vans in and out of the field and flattened the ruts with a 4 ton roller as the weather improved. During the time we had the tractor I managed to put 14 miles on the clock, just going around a seven acre field.

There are other stories from these and other holiday rallies we have run, maybe for a later date.
